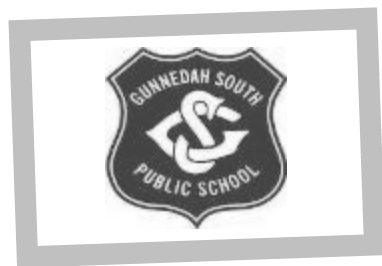

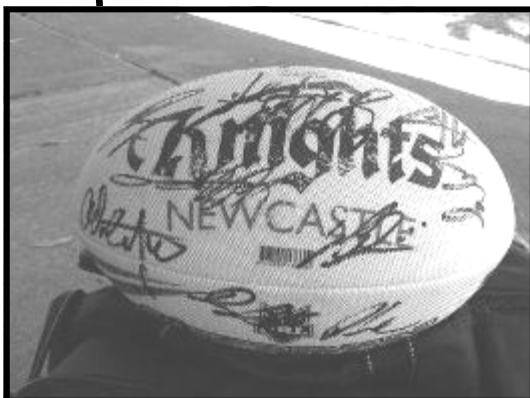

# Up the Back with Leigh and Virginia

## Cattle Showing

Mr Finlay's South School steers Angus and Mikey and the heifer Shorty have graduated from their course. They are currently chilling out in the Upper Hunter. All three acquitted themselves very well at the Upper Hunter Beef Bonanza at White Park in Scone on Saturday and Sunday last. Mikey was in the unled class 400 to 450 kgs. Angus and Shorty were in the led classes and all behaved as we would expect South School representatives to behave, impeccably.

Angus and Shorty were paraded in their own classes - where they were judged on their bovine attributes - and then backed up in the paraders' competition, in which the children were judged on their cattle handling skills. Angus, Shorty and the children had a big weekend. Mr Finlay had an even bigger one.

The contentment of all of the animals at the Upper Hunter Beef Bonanza was exemplified by the quietude of the showground at all times but especially after dark. In stark contrast to most cattle yards, and particularly our local saleyards where foreign cattle are brought together, there was not a murmur. There were 350 animals from hundreds of kilometres distant, all together, tethered in their stalls within metres of over 500 cattle handlers camping on the nearby lawns and never a sound was heard. Those were the most pampered, contented cattle this side of Jupiter.

The children who had spent many afternoons after school over recent months and who attended the Upper Hunter Beef Bonanza were: Jarrett Talbott, Tom Lyne, Kurt Rennick, Ned Tassell, Connor Gallagher, Harry Mason, Callum Letts and James Staughton.

The excursion was superbly organised by Mr Finlay and ran accordingly. That organisation was bolstered by the attendance of Kendra and Willie Mason, Noeline Stanger, Annie and George Lyne, Geoff and Tania Gallagher, Brooke, Jed, Hope and Gavin Rennick and Lucy and Rob Staughton. The Staughtons very kindly donated their truck and the Rennicks brought the Taj Mahal of camping equipment, without either of which, our excursion would have been a far lesser experience. Thanks also goes to Mrs Lynda Heath who looked after 6H while Mr Humphries was trucking the cattle south and trying to meet the curfew on Friday afternoon.

Feeding cattle for shows such as the Upper Hunter Beef Bonanza is a worthwhile exercise whereby interested children develop significant skills and acquire invaluable knowledge. As with many worthwhile ventures, it is costly and to defray the costs of future ventures, we are looking to raise funds, as usual, through the largesse of the community. The school would like to buy some weaners and place 1 or 2 with any interested landholders until the weaners grow out and return a profit which will then be invested into the feeding and maintenance of future show animals. The financial returns to the landholder in this arrangement would be in line with a number of other rural pursuits of late - zero, but of course there will be oodles of satisfaction to be had, merely from being involved. If such a venture proves irresistible to you, contact Mr Humphries or Mr Finlay. We know that with the current dry spell this may not be an opportune time but still contact us so that we may plan for the future when our region is once again bathed in verdant pasture.

Whilst on the topic of philanthropy, we, Leigh and Virginia, would like to thank in advance, all of those people who, at the time of this going to press will be attending Kindness Day, purchasing a sausage sandwich and in so doing, contributing towards the upgrading of the animal facilities here at South and thereby reducing the risks to our animals of mutilation by stupidity as happened when our school was recently vandalised.

# Zoe earns state call-up for Girls Cricket team

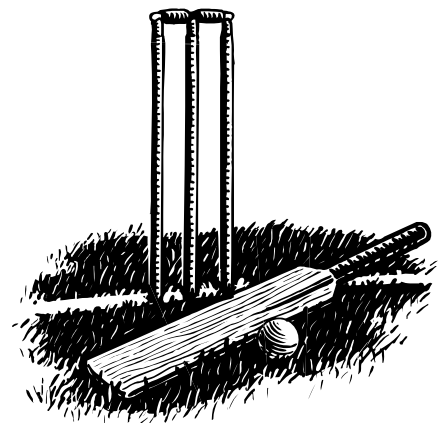

Mr Barton was on hand to meet the students and award prizes at the first ever shooting carnival of this type in the area, hosted by the Tamworth Clay Target Club last Friday. James Staughton was there shooting for Gunnedah South School, joining over 30 students from schools from Moree, Narrabri, Tamworth, Armidale and Scone. The students competed in squads of five, shooting the discipline known as 'down the line', or DTL. The DTL layout is set up with 5 stands in a crescent shape 15m from a traphouse which throws a clay target out in an unknown direction at an average speed of 70 kph. # Recipe of the Week!

## Pumpkin and Silver Beet Risotto

**Season:** Winter /Spring .

**Serves** 4 or 18 tastes

### Ingredients:

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 tablespoon butter or dairy free margarine
- 1 clove garlic, finely minced
- 1/2 onion, finely chopped
- 1 spring onion, finely chopped
- 1 cup arborio rice
- 400g pumpkin, diced into 1cm cubes
- 4 cups chicken stock liquid
- 3 leaves silver beet, stalks removed and finely shredded
- 1/4 cup grated parmesan cheese
- 1 bunch parsley, finely chopped
- 2 shakes pepper



### Method:

1. Wash and prepare all of the vegetables.
2. Measure all ingredients ready for use.
3. Heat up the saucepan on heat 6.
4. Add the **olive oil** and **butter**.
5. Sauté the **garlic, onion** and **spring onion** until soft.
6. Tip in the **pumpkin** and stir and cook for 4 minutes.
7. Stir in the **arborio rice** and keep stirring for around 4 minutes.
8. Add a ladleful of the **chicken stock** and stir well until no liquid is left.
9. Continue this process until all of the chicken stock is gone.
10. Mix in the **spinach**.
11. Stir until rice is soft and the spinach is wilted and cooked.
12. Remove the saucepan from the heat and add **parmesan cheese** and **parsley**.
13. Serve and enjoy!
