Whooping Cough

In Gunnedah recently there have been confirmed cases of whooping cough. Whooping cough can affect people of all ages but can be especially serious in babies and young children.

The symptoms usually begin like a cold with a blocked or runny nose, tiredness, mild fever and a cough. The cough gets worse and severe bouts of uncontrollable coughing can develop.

Whooping cough is spread when an infectious person coughs bacteria into the air which can be inhaled by people nearby. If they are not treated early, people with whooping cough can be infectious in the first three weeks of their illness. Vaccinations do reduce the risk of infection but if you are concerned about a member of your family please see a doctor as soon as possible. 
